## Gold Coast Rollers WNWBL Season 2025 Summary

The 2025 Women's National Wheelchair Basketball League (WNWBL) season was a landmark year for the Gold Coast Rollers, as the team proudly stepped onto the national stage to compete against Australia's most established and respected wheelchair basketball programs.

Facing elite opposition including the Perth Wheelcats, Victoria Wonders, Sydney Blues, Adelaide Thunder and Sydney Uni Lions, the Rollers embraced the challenge of national competition with determination and ambition. Each round provided invaluable experience, accelerating athlete development and showcasing Gold Coast Basketball's growing commitment to high-performance pathways and inclusive sport.

While the opening rounds tested the team against seasoned opponents, the Rollers' growth across the season was undeniable. Improvements in teamwork, structure and scoring efficiency became increasingly evident, culminating in a dominant July series against Adelaide. In a statement performance, the GC Rollers delivered three commanding victories (72–32, 60–36 and 72–24), highlighting the rapid progression of the program and the power of consistent training and competition at the elite level.

The season closed against the formidable Sydney Uni Lions, where the Rollers continued to demonstrate resilience, confidence and an increasingly potent offensive game against one of the league's most experienced squads.

Off the court, community engagement reached new heights. Home games at Carrara Indoor Sports Stadium attracted an average crowd of 200 spectators per game, while online audiences surged to as many as 500 viewers during Round Two — a clear sign of the growing excitement and support surrounding women's wheelchair basketball on the Gold Coast.

The 2025 Rollers squad represented the club with pride, professionalism and unwavering commitment throughout the season. The experience gained has laid a powerful foundation for future success, positioning the team for continued growth and stronger competitive outcomes as they look ahead to the 2026 WNWBL season.
